
I hope the New Year brings much happiness to you and your family.

A Few Words From the Curator

I would like to throw out a few words of thanks to all those who helped make 2015 a very successful and memorable year for DAHS. Thanks especially to those who contributed to the Foster Wheeler display in the museum, which has garnered numerous compliments. FW was such a monumental part of our village's history and deserves this recognition. And speaking of monuments, the completion of the Pioneer Park memorial will surely be remembered as one of the signature events in our village for the year 2015. Looking across the street from the Museum...especially at night, when the light shines down upon it...everyone who worked so hard toward the completion of that project should be proud of their efforts.

On a personal note, it's been almost 30 years since I joined the Dansville Area Historical Society, originally working with the late Bob Hamsher in updating the Museum accessioning. (A project that never ends!) Since then, I've helped in setting up displays for the museum, I penned the "Dansville Turns 200" articles that appeared in the *Genesee Country Express* newspaper in the years leading up to the village bicentennial in 1995, established the Dansville Hall of Fame, and written and narrated our slide presentation on the Castle. Currently, I'm working on my "Object Lessons" project, telling the history of Dansville, "show-and-tell" style, using 100 museum artifacts (you've seen several examples in recent issues of the newsletter). Through it all, I've benefitted from the support and encouragement of my friends and fellow Board members, past and present, and I am grateful to them all. I am especially grateful to Jane Schryver, who's been a constant source of help and inspiration over the years, and I continue to pray for her improved health. Many thanks, Jane!

In November, David Gilbert, Nancy Helfrich, and Paul Hoffman presented "The Jackson Sanatorium – the First 50 Years" sponsored by the Lima Historical Society to a standing room only crowd. Narration was written by David, with slides digitized by Paul and Jane Schryver from original glass slides in the DAHS Museum Collection.

Website Happenings

Since creating the **website (dansvilleareahistoricalsociety.wordpress.com)** in 2012, we have made a total 74 posts. Some of the posts on the website in 2015 include:

- Dansville Seminary was incorporated by the New York State Regents
- The debut of "Dansville Turns 200" appears in *Genesee Country Express*
- American Legion holds 1st Bingo game (repost)
- Kings Daughters Home opened (repost)
- Foster Wheeler Exhibit at the Museum Grand Opening

- Posts were also made for the programs and annual dinner meeting in 2015

In 2015 we have averaged 28 views per day which is up from last year and every previous year. January happened to have the highest daily views, averaging 44 views per day (1,368 views for the month). Posts were viewed 6,108 times on the website between 12/08/2014 and 12/08/2015. For 2015, the total website views were 9,451 by 4,701 visitors.

Likes on our **Facebook page (Dansville Area Historical Society)** have gone from 397 in 2014 to 560 total page likes in Dec 2015. As you would expect, the largest number of page likes are by people from Dansville (141), followed by Rochester (65), Geneseo (39), Wayland (28) and New York City and Hornell with 11 page likes each. The furthest page likes (2) come all the way from San Francisco, CA.

The Facebook page still gets offers to donate items, people looking for pictures of family members, requests for information on history of various people, places and things, and sharing of historical and community events.

We are looking forward to posting new and returning Business members in 2016 on the website. If you are a business member, please send use some information about your business to post on our website. We particularly like historical fact about your business.
